









ROADMAP



DISSOCIATIVE IDENTITY DISORDER

Identity disruption indicated by the presence of two or more distinct personality states.

Formerly known as Multiple Personality Disorder.

The split personalities

AKA "alters" usually

have their own distinct:

- > Name
- > Age
- > Gender
- > Moods
- > Speech/Vocabulary

Alter switches due to a stressor or trigger

SYMPTOMS







- Presence of 2+ personality states
- Amnesia
- Unexplained events/Out-of-body experiences
- Hallucinations
- Disturbances not due to direct physiological effects of a substance e.g. alcohol





ALTERS



- Name: Beth
- > Age: 5
- > Gender: Female
- > Moods: Playful, childish
- Speech/ Vocabulary:Limited, slow-paced
- Trigger: colorful lights, hearing nursery rhymes, educational institutions

- Name: David
- > Age: 35
- > Gender: Male
- Moods: Aggressive, arrogant
- Speech/ Vocabulary:Rude, swearing, harsh
- Trigger: being under high pressure e.g. traffic jam

Causes of DID Theories

Trauma-linked theory:

This theory suggest that DID occurs due to it serving as a defensive mechanism as a response to cruelty or abandonment

Non-trauma linked theory:


This theory suggests that DID occurs due to a non trauma related reason and is instead formed through improper treatment and socio cultural influences





FACTORS OF CAUSES OF DID

- 1. Individuals have high hypnotizability
- 2. Traumatic experience
- 3. Emotional or social deprivation
- 4. Mental or emotional and external factors




TREATMENT

- Talk therapy (psychotherapy)
- Medication (antidepressants)







